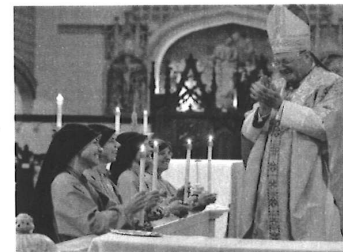
Helping Educators Reach Kids
