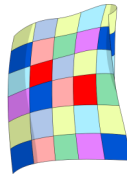


*“For the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.” (Mark 10:45)*

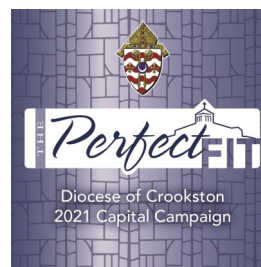

# Cup of Salvation: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Readings:

[Isaiah 53:10-11](#)  
[Psalm 33:4-5, 18-20, 22](#)  
[Hebrews 4:14-16](#)  
[Mark 10:35-45](#)



The sons of Zebedee hardly know what they're asking in today's Gospel. They are thinking in terms of how the Gentiles rule, of royal privileges and honors. But the road to Christ's kingdom is by way of His Cross. To share in His glory, we must be willing to drink the cup that He drinks.

The cup is an Old Testament image for God's judgment. The wicked would be made to drink this cup in punishment for their sins (see [Psalm 75:9](#); [Jeremiah 25:15, 28](#); [Isaiah 51:17](#)). But Jesus has come to drink this cup on behalf of all humanity. He has come to be baptized—which means plunged or immersed—into the sufferings we all deserve for our sins (compare [Luke 12:50](#)).

In this He will fulfill the task of Isaiah's suffering servant, whom we read about in today's First Reading.

Like Isaiah's servant, the Son of Man will give His life as an offering for sin, as once Israel's priests offered sacrifices for the sins of the people (see [Leviticus 5:17-19](#)).

Jesus is the heavenly high priest of all humanity, as we hear in today's Epistle. Israel's high priests offered the blood of goats and calves in the temple sanctuary. But Jesus entered the heavenly sanctuary with His own blood (see [Hebrews 9:12](#)). And by bearing our guilt and offering His life to do the will of God, Jesus ransomed "the many"—paying the price to redeem humanity from spiritual slavery to sin and death.

He has delivered us from death, as we rejoice in today's Psalm.

We need to hold fast to our confession of faith, as today's Epistle exhorts us. We must look upon our trials and sufferings as our portion of the cup He promised to those who believe in Him (see [Colossians 1:24](#)). We must remember that we have been baptized into His passion and death (see [Romans 6:3](#)).

In confidence, let us approach the altar today, the throne of grace, at which we drink the cup of His saving blood (see [Mark 14:23-24](#)).

## **Summary of Parish Pastoral Council Meeting**

The council met October 5. Present were Fr. Andrew Obel, council members, Lynn Erickson, Lois Thiessen, Andrew Dignan, Nancy Ellenson and Bruce Beisel and trustee Harold Thiessen . Absent was Mary Marvin.

Beginning October 9 a survey will be conducted for Going Forth As Disciples ministry. (This is different from recent parish survey.) The results will give us a vision for our parish and next steps to take.

The Reunite Committee sent personal cards to parishioners and planned a potluck and fun night that was to be held in September but was cancelled due to increase in Covid-19 cases. It may take place in October.

We will create awareness of liturgical seasons and special days by information or activities. This may be a one-time event or over a period of time; parish or family activity. Some suggestions were made.

Sign up for liturgical minister first-time and renewal training will be scheduled for the first week of November. The baptismal font project is progressing; this is the first priority, more funds are needed. The exterior sign project will be worked on by a different company; this is the second priority, more funds are needed.

Our Religious Education coordinator has resigned due to family illness. A new coordinator will be sought. RE classes will begin October 27. Pre-k and grade 1 will be Sunday morning, other grades on Wednesday. More teachers are needed. Mass of Light will be again in November.

Next meeting will be November 2.
