Renewal and the story of love

What was today's news about? Was any of it uplifting? Or was it about a world growing cold and distant from one another? Pope St. John Paul II said, "Religion itself, without the experience of wondrous discovery of the Son of God and communion with him who became our brother, becomes a mere set of principles which are increasingly difficult to understand, and rules which are increasingly hard to accept." (Pastoral Visit in Kazakhstan, September 23, 2001.)

We need to understand that the heart of the Eucharistic Renewal is about sharing the love story of Jesus in our lives through our actions with a cold and hurting world. It's about starting in our homes, our churches, our communities. It's a call to action. The world today seems to only be aware of Catholic's seemingly rigid rules and beliefs about marriage, contraception, and abortion. Not that we want to soften any of those beliefs! But we do need to learn how to express these things in the context of love. And the only place we can experience that love in all its fullness is with and through Christ in the Holy Eucharist.

God Is with Us: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Fourth Sunday of Advent

Readings:

[Isaiah 7:10–14](#)

[Psalm 24:1–6](#)

[Romans 1:1–7](#)

[Matthew 1:18–24](#)

The mystery kept secret for long ages, promised through His prophets in the holy Scriptures, is today revealed (see [Romans 16:25–26](#)).

This is the “Gospel of God” that Paul celebrates in today’s Epistle—the good news that “God is with us” in Jesus Christ. The sign promised to the House of David in today’s First Reading is given in today’s Gospel. In the virgin found with child, God Himself has brought to Israel a savior from David’s royal line (see [Acts 13:22–23](#)).

Son of David according to the flesh, Jesus is the Son of God, born of the Spirit. He will be anointed with the Spirit (see [Acts 10:38](#)), and by the power of Spirit will be raised from the dead and established at God’s right hand in the heavens (see [Acts 2:33–34](#); [Ephesians 1:20–21](#)).

He is the “King of Glory” we sing of in today’s Psalm. The earth in its fullness has been given to Him. And as God swore long ago to David, His Kingdom will have no end (see [Psalm 89:4–5](#)).

In Jesus Christ we have a new creation. Like the creation of the world, it is a work of the Spirit, a blessing from the Lord (see [Genesis 1:2](#)). In Him, we are saved from our sins, are called now “the beloved of God.”

All nations now are called to belong to Jesus Christ, to enter into the House of David and kingdom of God, the Church. Together, through the obedience of faith, we have been made a new race—a royal people that seeks for the face of the God of Jacob.

He has made our hearts clean; He has made us worthy to enter His holy place, to stand in His presence and serve Him. In the Eucharist, the everlasting covenant is renewed, the Advent promise of virgin with child—God with us—continues until the end of the age (see [Matthew 28:20](#); [Ezekiel 37:24–28](#)).

Three plates of cookies went to the senior living center, three went to homebound, two went to people unable to attend mass on weekends, one delivered to a parishioner recovering from surgery, one was hand delivered to El Paso Texas where a parishioner’s father has been in ICU for a month!

As we came together with our life experienced parishioners and youth, we showed them what it means to share our gifts of time and talent with others for the glory of God. Not just in the form of baked goods but more importantly in the form of LOVE!!

The love of God and the presence of the Holy Spirit were thicker than the mounds of frosting and sprinkles on the cookies!
