Education Corner

Why do you believe Mary remained a virgin? Didn't Jesus have brothers and sisters? This is a somewhat common misconception related to the language used in scripture, which is so different from our use of the term brother today.

According to the Catholic Answers web site, "the earliest explanation of the 'brothers' of the Lord is found in a document known as the Protoevangelium of James, which was written around A.D. 150. It speaks of Mary as a consecrated virgin since her youth, and of St. Joseph as an elderly widower with children who was chosen to be Mary's spouse for the purposes of guarding and protecting her while respecting her vow of virginity. Though this document is not on the level of Sacred Scripture, it was written very early, and it may contain accurate historical traditions. Emmaus and Us: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Third Sunday of Easter

We should put ourselves in the shoes of the disciples in today's Gospel. Downcast and confused, they're making their way down the road, unable to understand all the things that have occurred.

They know what they've seen—a prophet mighty in word and deed. They know what they were hoping for—that He would be the redeemer of Israel. But they don't know what to make of His violent death at the hands of their rulers.



They can't even recognize Jesus as He draws near to walk with them. He seems like just another foreigner visiting Jerusalem for the Passover.

Note that Jesus doesn't disclose His identity until they describe how they found His tomb empty but "Him they did not see." That's how it is with us, too. Unless He revealed Himself, we would see only an empty tomb and a meaningless death.

How does Jesus make Himself known at Emmaus? First, He interprets "all the Scriptures" as referring to Him. In today's First Reading and Epistle, Peter also opens the Scriptures to proclaim the meaning of Christ's death according to the Father's "set plan"—foreknown before the foundation of the world.

Jesus is described as a new Moses and a new Passover lamb. He is the one of whom David sang in today's Psalm, whose soul was not abandoned to corruption but was shown the path of life.

After opening the Scriptures, Jesus at table took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to the disciples—exactly what He did at the Last Supper (see [Luke 22:14-20](#)).

In every Eucharist, we reenact that Easter Sunday at Emmaus. Jesus reveals Himself to us in our journey. He speaks to our hearts in the Scriptures. Then at the table of the altar, in the person of the priest, He breaks the bread.

The disciples begged Him, "Stay with us." So He does. Though He has vanished from our sight, in the Eucharist—as at Emmaus—we know Him in the breaking of the bread.




First Communion and Confirmation Families –

PRIEST ASSIGNMENT CHANGES 2023

Dear friends,

As I announced at all the Masses last weekend, Bishop Andrew Cozzens has made some changes to the priest personnel in our Diocese. Those changes affected me as well. The bishop requested me to move to St. Michael's Church, Mahnomen, and St. Joseph's, Church, Beaulieu as parochial administrator. In addition to that I will also become the judicial vicar of the Diocese of Crookston. As the judicial vicar, I will have oversight over the canonical issues of the Diocese including overseeing the diocesan Tribunal and processing marriage nullity cases. I will have an office at the diocesan pastoral center in Crookston, where I will go once or twice a week. These changes will become effective on July 1st, 2023. The priest who will replace me as parochial administrator of St. Mary's, Church-Warroad, St. Joseph's, Church-Williams, and Sacred Heart Church-Baudette is Fr. Christon Muhero. Fr. Christon is currently the associate pastor of St. Philip's, Church, Bemidji. He is a priest ordained for the Archdiocese of Blantyre, Malawi, Africa. He came to the United States in November 2021 as a priest on loan to the Diocese of Crookston. He was born in December 1973 in Malawi and ordained a priest in September 2003.

I ask you to pray for me, Fr. Christon, and all the priests of our Diocese who are moving or retiring this summer.
