
### Education Corner

# The Good News: Scott Hahn Reflects on the Ascension of the Lord

Readings:

[Acts 1:1-11](#)  
[Psalm 47:2-3, 6-7, 8-9](#)  
[Ephesians 1:17-23](#)  
[Matthew 28:16-20](#)



In today's First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Luke gives the surprising news that there is more of the story to be told. The story did not end with the empty tomb, or with Jesus' appearances to the Apostles over the course of forty days. Jesus' saving work will have a liturgical consummation. He is the great high priest, and He has still to ascend to the heavenly Jerusalem, there to celebrate the feast in the true Holy of Holies.

The truth of this feast shines forth from the Letter to the Hebrews, where we read of the great high priest's passing through the heavens, the sinless intercessor's sacrifice on our behalf (see [Hebrews 4:14-15](#)).

Indeed, His intercession will lead to the Holy Spirit's descent in fire upon the Church. Luke spells out that promise in the First Reading for the feast of the Ascension: "in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit" ([Acts 1:5](#)). The Ascension is the preliminary feast that directs the Church's attention forward to Pentecost. On that day, salvation will be complete; for salvation is not simply expiation for sins (that would be wonder enough), but it is something even greater than that. Expiation is itself a necessary precondition of our adoption as God's children. To live that divine life we must receive the Holy Spirit. To receive the Holy Spirit we must be purified through Baptism.

The Responsorial Psalm presents the Ascension in terms familiar from the worship of the Jerusalem Temple in the days of King Solomon: "God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord" (Psalm 47). The priest-king takes his place at the head of the people, ruling over the nations, establishing peace.

The Epistle strikes a distinctively Paschal note. In the early Church, as today, Easter was the normal time for the baptism of adult converts. The sacrament was often called "illumination" or "enlightenment" because of the light that came with God's saving grace (see, for example, [Hebrews 10:32](#)). Saint Paul, in his Letter to the Ephesians, speaks in terms of glory that leads to greater glories still, as Ascension leads to Pentecost: "May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened," he writes, as he looks to the divinization of the believers. Their "hope" is "his inheritance among the holy ones," the saints who have been adopted into God's family and now rule with Him at the Father's right hand.

This is the "good news" the Apostles are commissioned to spread—to the whole world, to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem—at the Ascension. It's the good news we must spread today.

# 40 Hour Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

**CHANGE OF EVENTS:** St. Mary's Catholic Church, Warroad, Minnesota, along with Sacred Heart, Baudette, and St. Joseph's, Williams, will be holding a parish mission on Thursday, June 1<sup>st</sup>, from 6:00pm to 8:00 pm Deacon Mark Krejci, Office of Formation in Discipleship for the Diocese of Crookston, will lead the mission called: *"Becoming What We Eat."* Deacon Mark will guide us in a prayerful reflection on the Mass and how the Sacred Liturgy prepares us to be missionary disciples of Jesus Christ. Pope Francis writes, *"In virtue of their baptism, all members of the people of God have become missionary disciples."* This mission will help us discern how we are all called to share the Love of God with those we meet, prepared and strengthened by the Eucharist.

As you all know, the Bishops of the United States called for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The three years are divided into diocesan year (June 19, 2022 -- June 11, 2023), parish year (June 11, 2023 --July 17, 2024), and year of going out on mission (July 21, 2024-Pentecost Sunday 2025). These three years will culminate in a National Eucharistic Congress to be held in Indianapolis, Indiana, on July 17-21, 2024.

The parish year of the Eucharistic revival will begin on June 11, 2023, on the feast of Corpus Christi (The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ).

In our three parishes, we shall mark the beginning of the parish phase with a 40-hour Eucharistic Adoration at St. Mary's, Warroad beginning on Thursday, June 1st with Mass at 5:15pm and ending on Saturday, June 3rd with a benediction at 2:30 pm. There will be a similar arrangement in Baudette during that time. It will be announced soon. Confession will also be offered after Mass during this time.

We encourage parishioners to sign up for at least one hour to be with the Lord during adoration so all shifts are covered. There is a sign up sheet at the entrance of the church. We thank you for your co-operation. You are welcome to come in and pray anytime even if shift is covered, we just need to make sure there is one person in adoration at all times. For safety reasons, KoC members will also be here during the hours of 8pm - 8am when the church is closed to help let members into and out of the building.

## Few Shouts of Praise and Glory:


For all those who served as Religious Education and children liturgy teachers this school year; for the cooks and servers in the house; the magic cookie makers; and our KofCs. Thank you all!
