Education Corner

Why are some of the consecrated hosts reserved after the Mass?

While it would be possible to eat all of the bread that is consecrated during the Mass, some is usually kept in the tabernacle. The Body of Christ under the appearance of bread that is kept or "reserved" after the Mass is commonly referred to as the "Blessed Sacrament." There are several pastoral reasons for reserving the Blessed Sacrament. First of all, it is used for distribution to the dying (Viaticum), the sick, and those who legitimately cannot be present for the celebration of the Eucharist. Secondly, the Body of Christ in the form of bread is to be adored when it is exposed, as in the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction, when it is carried in eucharistic processions, or when it is simply placed in the tabernacle, before which people pray privately.

A Mighty Wind: Scott Hahn Reflects on Pentecost Sunday

The giving of the Spirit to the new people of God crowns the mighty acts of the Father in salvation history.

The Jewish feast of Pentecost called all devout Jews to Jerusalem to celebrate their birth as God's chosen people in the covenant Law given to Moses at Sinai (see [Leviticus 23:15–21](#); [Deuteronomy 16:9–11](#)).



In today's First Reading, the mysteries prefigured in that feast are fulfilled in the pouring out of the Spirit on Mary and the Apostles (see [Acts 1:14](#)).

The Spirit seals the new law and new covenant brought by Jesus, written not on stone tablets but on the hearts of believers, as the prophets promised (see [2 Corinthians 3:2–8](#); [Romans 8:2](#)).

The Spirit is revealed as the life-giving breath of the Father, the Wisdom by which He made all things, as we sing in today's Psalm. In the beginning, the Spirit came as a "mighty wind" sweeping over the face of the earth (see [Genesis 1:2](#)). And in the new creation of Pentecost, the Spirit again comes as "a strong, driving wind" to renew the face of the earth.

As God fashioned the first man out of dust and filled him with His Spirit (see [Genesis 2:7](#)), in today's Gospel we see the New Adam become a life-giving Spirit, breathing new life into the Apostles (see [1 Corinthians 15:45, 47](#)).

Like a river of living water, for all ages He will pour out His Spirit on His body, the Church, as we hear in today's Epistle (see also [John 7:37–39](#)).

We receive that Spirit in the sacraments, being made a "new creation" in Baptism (see [2 Corinthians 5:17](#); [Galatians 6:15](#)). Drinking of the one Spirit in the Eucharist (see [1 Corinthians 10:4](#)), we are the first fruits of a new humanity—fashioned from out of every nation under heaven, with no distinctions of wealth or language or race, a people born of the Spirit.

40 Hour Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

June 1st — 3rd, 2023

St. Mary's Catholic Church, Warroad, Minnesota, along with Sacred Heart, Baudette, and St. Joseph's, Williams, **will be holding a parish mission on Thursday, June 1st, from 6:00pm to 8:00 pm** Deacon Mark Krejci, Office of Formation in Discipleship for the Diocese of Crookston, will lead the mission called: "*Becoming What We Eat*" Deacon Mark will guide us in a prayerful reflection on the Mass and how the Sacred Liturgy prepares us to be missionary disciples of Jesus Christ. Pope Francis writes, "*In virtue of their baptism, all members of the people of God have become missionary disciples.*" This mission will help us discern how we are all called to share the Love of God with those we meet, prepared and strengthened by the Eucharist.

In our three parishes, we shall mark the beginning of the parish phase with a 40-hour Eucharistic Adoration at St. Mary's, Warroad beginning on Thursday, June 1st with Mass at 5:15pm and ending on Saturday, June 3rd with a benediction at 2:30 pm. There will be a similar arrangement in Baudette during that time. It will be announced soon. Confession will also be offered after Mass during this time.

We encourage parishioners to sign up for at least one hour to be with the Lord during adoration so all shifts are covered. There is a sign up sheet at the entrance of the church. We thank you for your co-operation. You are welcome to come in and pray anytime even if shift is covered, we just need to make sure there is one person in adoration at all times. For safety reasons, KoC members will also be here during the hours 8pm - 8am when the church is closed to help let members into and out of the building.

As you all know, the Bishops of the United States called for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The three years are divided into diocesan year (June 19, 2022 -- June 11, 2023), parish year (June 11, 2023 --July 17, 2024), and year of going out on mission (July 21, 2024-Pentecose Sunday 2025). These three years will culminate in a National Eucharistic Congress to be held in Indianapolis, Indiana, on July 17-21, 2024.

The parish year of the Eucharistic revival will begin on June 11, 2023, on the feast of Corpus Christi (The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ).
