

Youth, currently in grades 9 – 12 are invited to take part in a unique experience, beginning at the Pastoral Center in Crookston, and traveling to Indianapolis, Indiana for the National Eucharistic Congress.

Rough Schedule* of Saint Teresa of Calcutta Camp: Eucharistic Pilgrimage to Indianapolis

Day 1 Sunday, July 14 Participants arrive at the Pastoral Center in Crookston

Day 2 Monday, July 15 Formation Day – Pastoral Center

Day 3 Tuesday, July 16 Begin Journey to Indianapolis (Stop #1 TBA)

Day 4 Wednesday, July 17 Arrive in Indianapolis – Check-in – Opening of National Eucharistic Congress

Day 5 Thursday, July 18 National Eucharistic Congress - Day 2

Day 6 Friday, July 19 National Eucharistic Congress – Day 3

Day 7 Saturday, July 20 National Eucharistic Congress – Day 4

Day 8 Sunday, July 21 National Eucharistic Congress – Closing Mass, Commissioning

Day 9 Monday, July 22 Arrive back in the Diocese of Crookston

***A detailed schedule is being developed.**

Sunday and **Monday** will be an opportunity for formation, team building, and preparation for the pilgrimage. The youth will stay overnight in the Pastoral Center. On **Tuesday**, we will travel by charter bus to South Bend, Indiana where we will spend the night. On **Wednesday**, participants will take a tour of Notre Dame University, and make our way to Indianapolis for check-in and the opening session of the National Eucharistic Congress. While in Indianapolis, **Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday**, our group will follow the youth track schedule for the National Eucharistic Congress. The experience for the youth will be much like a Steubenville Conference, but we will assemble with all the pilgrims from across the country – 80,000 strong! – each morning and evening during the general sessions. A more detailed schedule is pending. Following the noon Mass on Sunday, all

pilgrims will be commissioned for the missionary year of the National Eucharistic Revival and return to the Diocese of Crookston early morning, **Monday**, July 22.

Cost The estimated cost is \$1,375.00 per participant. This includes registration, transportation, rooms, and food for the 9-day experience.

Lodging –we will be assigned to a local college campus dormitory in Indianapolis. Specific assignments to the Diocese of Crookston in early May.

Transportation– the Diocese of Crookston has contracted with Schuck Bus of Moorhead. Schuck Bus will shuttle our group to and from Indianapolis. Schuck Bus will also be with our group, for the entire week to shuttle us to Lucas Oil Field, from our (to be assigned) housing.

Payment Plan

March 1, 2024: First Payment of \$500.00 Due

May 1, 2024: Second Payment of \$500.00 Due

July 1, 2024: Balance Due (Expected balance - \$275)
