Instead, our hearts long for something deeper that can only be filled by God. Ask God daily how He wants you to live the life He intended for you.



Books Available At Sacred Heart

There are several new books available in the entry to the Church. These are books that were suggested as further reading in the book Beautiful Eucharist that was given out at Christmas time. Here are just a few:

Catholic and Christian

You're on the spot. Someone wants you to explain some aspect of Catholic belief. Do you really think the pope is infallible? Why do Catholics pray to Mary? Where do sacraments come from? What do you think of the Bible? Are you saved? You wish some well-informed Catholic friend were around to help with the answer.

Or perhaps you are asking the questions yourself. Where do Catholic beliefs come from? Why do we pray for the dead? How does the rosary fit into a biblical faith?

The best-selling Catholic and Christian provides the answers you need. It is a readable and concise summary of commonly misunderstood Catholic beliefs, the teachings and practices that don't get much attention in Sunday homilies and in religious education, but which puzzle Catholics and non-Catholics alike. This is a book for all Catholics who want to know more about their faith.

Made for More

While everything you do and every decision you make is aimed at making you happy, you may step back from time to time and ask yourself, "Why am I here?" and, "Is there a deeper meaning to life?" To find these answers, you need go beyond the distractions of the world and be open to discovering your true purpose and self-potential.

The Mindful Catholic

- Whether we are carrying out routine life behaviors, trying to pray, or conversing with others, the way our minds work significantly impacts how well we function. But many times we may feel like our mind has a mind of its own.

You fall into bed exhausted at the end of the day, craving a good night's sleep, only to have your mind race in a million directions.

- Prayer is an exercise in futility, full of distractions and wandering thoughts.
- In the midst of a conversation, you suddenly realize you haven't heard a word the other person has said.
- You arrive at a destination with no recollection of how you got there.

These all-too-common occurrences are examples of how our minds can seem to be completely out of our control. We end up merely going through the motions day after day, feeling anxious and preoccupied. But it doesn't have to be that way.

Dr. Greg Bottaro explains how mindfulness can help us become aware of the present moment and accept it. Catholic mindfulness is a way to practically trust God more in our lives. Instead of separating faith from day-to-day life, mindfulness helps bridge the gap so we can feel the sense of safety and peace God intends us to have.

Following the simple exercises in this book, you'll discover how mindfulness can help you be more present to everything in your life from a trip to the grocery store or relaxing with friends to listening more attentively to a homily or meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary.
