Greetings from North Country Koinonia. We are a retreat group that offers Koinonia retreats at St. Patrick's in Kelliher. We would like to extend a personal invitation to all of you to attend. Maybe you have never attended any kind of retreat before or have had many experiences of taking the time away for a retreat. Either way, this would be a close to home, inexpensive time for a renewal of your faith.

Our next weekend retreat is scheduled for March 15, 16, and 17, 2024. This is during Lent so it would be a great time to take some time out to be with our Lord and other Catholics on our journey. This is a Catholic retreat, however non-Catholic spouses are most welcome. Couples are encouraged to attend together, but sometimes this isn't possible so individuals are most welcome.

There may be some of you who came to a Koinonia years ago and might be wondering if you could come again. Absolutely, you would be very welcome.

This is a weekend consisting of talks by others who are part of the team, on various topics to enhance our building up of a community of faith and a stronger relationship with Jesus in our lives. Some Thoughts On Attending Mass

There is a church in Avila, built on the site of Saint Teresa's childhood home. In the sacristy where the priests prepare for Mass there is a large wooden crucifix on the wall. The crucifix is surrounded by these words, which have been painted on the wall.

“Priest of Jesus Christ, celebrate this Holy Mass as if it were your first Mass, your last Mass, your only Mass.”

Now, let me ask you a question: If you could only go to Mass once in your entire life, if you could only receive the Eucharist once, how satisfied or dissatisfied would you be with how you participated in Mass last Sunday?

So, this is my challenge to you today. From now on, each time you go to Mass, participate as if it were your first Mass, your last Mass, your only Mass.

Imagine you could only participate in Mass one more time before meeting God for the final judgment. How would you prepare? What would you wear? What intentions would you bring to the Mass? Who would you pray for knowing you wouldn't see them again in this lifetime?

I don't know when your last Mass will be. But I do know the best way to prepare yourself for that day is to approach each Mass you are blessed to attend as if it were your first, last, and only.
