

Congratulations to Those Receiving First Communion!

Today we celebrate with Joseph Summers, Simon Youso, and Makenzi Gubbels, as they receive the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ for the first time.

We pray that the grace of God continues to grow ever stronger in their hearts and that they grow ever closer to Him.

Something to pray with concerning our first Communion, and every time we receive the Body and Blood of Christ.

The first time you received Jesus in the Eucharist was a historic moment. You stepped into a 2,000 year history of men and women participating in Eucharistic glory. You became part of an eternal community that includes angels and saints who all come to the same table for this one meal. You received Jesus into your body and soul in the most intimate way possible for the first time.

Whether you receive the Eucharist for the first time at seven or seventy, that first time is just the beginning of the rest of your life. Every time you receive Jesus from that point forward, you have the chance to have a powerful encounter with the Alpha and the Omega.

One of the greatest temptations around the Eucharist is to treat it like a regular part of our routine instead of the most significant moment of our week. The way to move beyond that spiritual obstacle is to begin to build anticipation. Throughout the week, prepare for Mass by praying the Spiritual Communion each day, by reflecting on the Gospel for the coming Sunday's Mass, by fasting in order to intentionally become mindful of the hunger in your soul, and by arriving a few minutes early to quiet your heart, mind, body, and soul before Mass begins.

We prepare for everything we consider to be important in this life. Preparation builds anticipation. Anticipation fills our souls with joy. When we don't prepare for Mass, we reveal our misplaced priorities and rob ourselves of so much of the joy God wants to give us through the Eucharistic experience.
