### The Star of the North Eucharistic

**Congress** begins May 17th, Friday evening at

7:00 PM with Eucharistic Adoration and a keynote presentation by Bishop Robert Barron. It continues Saturday with Mass at 9:00 AM, followed by a day filled with testimonies, music, interactive “Saints Alive” presentations for families, keynote addresses by Sister Jude Andrew, Bishop Andrew Cozzens, and Father Mike Schmitz. There will also be a large vendor and exhibit hall throughout the conference. The Congress concludes at 4:30 PM.

On Sunday, all are welcome to Lake Itasca State Park for outdoor Mass with Bishop Cozzens. The Mass of the Solemnity of Pentecost will take place at Itasca’s Pioneer Village, beginning at 10:00 AM. Following Mass, there will be a Eucharistic Procession to the headwaters of the Mississippi River. Here will commence the 1000 mile Eucharistic Procession along the Marian route of the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage.

If you cannot attend this pilgrimage we ask that you pray for all those going from across Minnesota, the Dakotas and Wisconsin, as we gather to celebrate and glorify Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. The Star of the North Eucharistic Congress will inspire pilgrims to increase their devotion in the Eucharist while learning ways to share the many graces of this great Sacrament through powerful talks and witness testimonies, panels, fellowship, praise and worship, Mass, Adoration, confession, and a Eucharistic Procession.

## **Thomas Aquinas on the Spiritual Journey of the Heart and Mind**

Thomas Aquinas had one of the greatest minds in human history. But he was intimately aware of two important truths that allude many great minds.

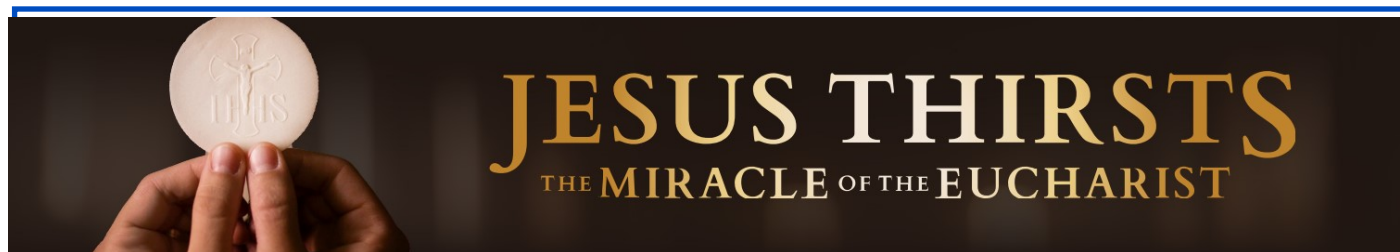
The first was this: The longest journey we make is from the head to the heart. It is a spiritual journey, a pilgrimage of prayer. We think of the heart as emotional, and it is, but it is also deeply spiritual. This was the second: There is a vast difference between knowing about God and knowing God.

Do you know Jesus, or do you just know about Jesus?

Saint Thomas Aquinas wasn't just a brilliant mind. He was a man driven by a deep love for God. He was a man of deep prayer. And at the very center of his life, the source of his wisdom and joy, was the Eucharist.

The same man who used Aristotelian philosophy to define Transubstantiation-the moment the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ- could hardly speak at times during the Mass because he was so moved when he participated in the actual miracle.

Thomas Aquinas' example invites us to ask some powerful questions about our own lives: Am I living my life from the mind? Am I living my life from the heart? Or have I found the delicate balance between the heart and the mind where love and wisdom reside?
