

The Beginning of the Northern Pilgrimage to the National Eucharistic Congress!

Bishop Andrew Cozzens gave the homily at the Mass near Itasca State Park on Pentecost Sunday.

In his homily, Bishop Cozzens, who chairs the board of the National Eucharistic Congress Inc., which is responsible for overseeing the congress in Indianapolis, said that a nationwide Eucharistic revival must begin in Catholics' hearts.

He encouraged Massgoers to receive the Eucharist worthily through frequent confession, ideally monthly.

"That's when the power of the Holy Spirit will be able to inhabit our hearts," he said. "All of us need repentance."

He encouraged the faithful, no matter their place on their journey, not to become complacent or settle for "a lukewarm spiritual life," believing that they have "reached their limit on holiness."

"There is no limit for holiness in your heart," he said. "The more you surrender to him (Jesus), the more he will work in you. What happens if the Holy Spirit actually begins to take over? What

happens is you begin to love to pray. God's word comes to life, and you actually go there to seek practical answers for your questions. What happens is that you begin to be so in love with Jesus that you can't help but share him with others, because you just talk about what you love. What happens is that you begin to form friendships and small communities of people who support you, who are like-minded, who also want to see the Holy Spirit spread across the country."
