### **Eucharistic Revival—Year Three**

If you want to watch any of the National Eucharistic Congress speakers their recordings can be found on EWTN streaming app. I would recommend watching each of the main speakers—their messages were so powerful.

We will learn more about Year 3 in the coming months—the theme is all about walking with people on their journey, just like the Road to Emmaus.

From Bishop Cozzens, “To this end, we have a new initiative for this mission year called “Walk with One”! This initiative is meant to challenge each of us to ask the Holy Spirit to show us one person whom we could accompany in and through these invitations.” But, before we go out, we too must encounter our Lord and seek him. Pope Francis exhorts us, “Let us make space for the prayer of silent adoration, in which we experience the presence of the Lord, like Moses, like Elijah, like Mary, like Jesus. Have we noticed that we have lost the sense of worship? Let us return to worship. Let us lend the ear of our hearts to the One who, in silence, wants to say to us: ‘I am your God—the God of mercy and compassion, the God of pardon and love, the God of tenderness and care...’ Do we believe that the Lord loves us, that the Lord loves me?” (Homily for Ash Wednesday, 2024). Pope Francis also teaches us that, in Eucharistic liturgy, we are guaranteed an encounter with Christ and his Paschal Mystery. More to come in the months ahead.

### **“I am with you always, to the end of the age.”**

When Jesus was about to ascend into heaven, He stood before His disciples and made an extraordinary promise: “I am with you always, to the end of the age.” At the heart of the Catholic faith is an unwavering belief that Jesus fulfills this promise through the Eucharist. Not only does He remain with us in spirit, He stays with us physically by giving us His Body and Blood in the Blessed Sacrament. The beauty of Catholic churches throughout the world is a testimony to this faith. Right now, even as you read this, somewhere in the world, Mass is being celebrated and Jesus is once again making good on His promise.

Jesus chooses to be with us -body and spirit- in every Tabernacle and on every altar in every Catholic church in the world. He promised to be with us until the end of the world, and He will never break that promise. The only question left is: Will we choose to be with Him?
