February Saint of the Month – St. Josephine Bakhita



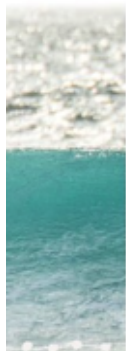
We do not know the original name of the woman who became St. Josephine Bakhita. She was born to an affluent family in Darfur, Sudan, in 1868. But their status was not enough to protect them from slave raiders. She was sold as a slave at least five times, to sometimes-cruel masters.

Eventually, she was gifted to an Italian merchant who took her to Italy to care for his daughters. In Venice, Bakhita took the man's daughters to a school run by religious sisters. It was here that she first learned about Jesus and the Catholic faith.

When the man was recalled to Africa, he wanted to take Bakhita with him, but she refused to leave. With support from the Canossian sisters and the patriarch of Venice, she was able to take her case to court and was declared a free woman, since her enslavement had been illegal since it began.

She became Catholic and was given the name Josephine in 1890. She joined the Daughters of Charity of Canossa in 1896. She was a member of their community in Italy for over 40 years, dedicating her life to comforting the poor and suffering.

She died in Italy in 1947. Her feast day is February 8th. She is the patron Saint of Sudan and of victims of slavery and human trafficking. Her feast day became the first international day for prayer and reflection on human trafficking in 2015.
