The Gift of Faith Formation

I was privileged to have Mass this week at Sacred Heart in East Grand Forks with many of those who serve in our Catholic schools, including leaders, faculty and staff. As we begin the new school year, I am grateful for all those who work in faith formation, and I am especially grateful for our young people. Sharing the truths of our faith is one of the most important things we do in our life. Helping our young people come to understand who Jesus is, what the Church is, and what difference Jesus Christ and his Church makes in our lives is essential to helping them find happiness.

To be able to share the faith though we must know it! The Catholic faith is the greatest intellectual treasure in the world. It contains the most beautiful and impactful truths, which if you come to understand them, can change your life. This is because the Catholic faith is revealed by God and gives insights to human life that cannot be found in any other way. Studying the Catholic faith is something you can do your whole life and never grow bored. I find especially the lives and the teaching of saints are inspiring and contain practical insights for me to live in our modern world. One example of this is a podcast I'm listening to called "The Desert Fathers with Bishop Erik Varden." He brings to life for us today the witness of these early saints in the Church. I try to read and study some aspect of the faith every day.

The sad thing is that many people stop studying their faith when they complete Confirmation. They don't realize that they've just scratched the surface, and that if they continue to study their faith, it will provide great and beautiful insights to help them find joy and happiness. One finds in nature that many things corrupt if they are not shared. Flowers, food, and seeds all must reach their destination to be used before they corrupt. This is the way the Catholic faith is also. If we simply hold on to it for ourselves, it will gradually corrupt, and we will not understand it fully. Rather, it is meant to be shared, and as we begin to share it, we see its power.

I want to say thank you to all those who will work in our catechetical formation programs this year, either in schools or religious education. Thank you for sharing your faith, because it causes the faith itself to grow and it gives an inestimable gift to our young people. I want to encourage every Catholic in the Diocese of Crookston to find ways to both study and share their faith this year. It is part of being a disciple, as Jesus calls us to be, that we're always growing and always sharing.

There are, of course, innumerable resources available to help you grow in your faith, if you'd like to. There's things like the Catechism in a Year and the Bible in a Year podcasts. There are resources like formed.org and certainly, so many wonderful books on any topic that has to do with our Catholic faith.

Let's commit ourselves to studying our faith this year at least in some small way and then finding ways to share it.
