

Sharing with others the saving love of Jesus

Do you ever ask yourself, “What is my role in Christ’s mission to save the world,” or at least, “What is my role in the salvation of my neighbor?”

There is only one savior of the world. God desired so much to save each human being from eternal death that he became one of us.

Jesus Christ, the savior of the world, lived among us and he suffered and died to reconcile us to the Father. Seeing the pain of our lives, seeing how we were trapped in our sins, seeing we were headed for eternal death, God wanted to share with each of us his divine life so we could live with him in love forever.

But how does God plan to save everyone? Jesus Christ lived at a specific time in history, and he did not just want to save the people of his time, he wanted all to be saved. This is why he established his Church, his living Body in the world, and he asked his followers to continue his mission and bring salvation to the whole world. As he told his disciples when he ascended into heaven,

“All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age.” (Mt 28:18-20)

The point is that “until the end of the age” includes now, and God’s plan includes you and me. If Jesus Christ is going to save those in our time, our neighbors, then it will be through people like you and me.

Do you believe you are God’s “Plan A” to bring someone to know his love and live with him forever? Do you believe God needs you to cooperate with his will in order to bring his saving love to those around you? Do you believe you are called to evangelize?

None of us could do this on our own. Salvation is the work of the Holy Spirit, but God wills to use human instruments, as he did through Mary and Joseph and the Apostles. You are his human instrument. You have a mission, and obligation to share with others the saving love of Jesus. You are called to be like Jesus and “to seek and to save the lost.” (Lk 19:10)

We are surrounded by so many people who don’t know him, who are literally dying from lack of love. So many whose lives are floating along without meaning, who don’t know the one who gives meaning to life.

So many who worship false gods of materialism, sports, success, and pleasure-seeking in vain happiness and joy. They end up empty, because these things can’t satisfy our hearts which were created for God.

When we become people of prayer our hearts become more like the heart of Jesus. When we spend time meditating on his word, adoring him in the Blessed Sacrament, or when we receive him in Holy Communion, he begins to make us love what he loves. We begin to feel the deep longing of his heart for those around us who don’t know his love. This love, which we experience from him, becomes a real fire in us and we understand what St. Paul felt when he said, “Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel!” (I Cor 9:16)

St. Paul knew what it was like to live without knowing Jesus Christ. He knew that when he encountered Jesus his whole life changed.

And because of this, he felt an obligation to share the Gospel with others. Do you feel this obligation?

This is the key to becoming an evangelist. It is the most important step. If you begin to understand the gift and feel an obligation to share it, God will show you how.

There are manifold ways, and you will learn. Let your heart feel the love of Jesus for you and for others.

You are his “Plan A” for someone in your life. Take the risk to share his love. It can change everything, forever.
