## REVIVAL

### Acts XXIX Presents Rescue Live

*In October, Catholics are invited to gather for a day that promises to deepen faith and awaken hearts to the transforming love of Christ. Father John Riccardo will bring his team from Acts XXIX to present their one-day Gospel revival, Rescue Live.*

Bishop Andrew H. Cozzens invited Father Riccardo to the diocese in May 2025 as a presenter for the annual Spring Priests Convocation. Bishop Cozzens asked him to return to the diocese in fall 2026 with Rescue Live to inspire the laity of the diocese.

“He explains so clearly why Jesus matters and what a difference Jesus makes,” Bishop Cozzens says.

A priest in the Archdiocese of Detroit for over 30 years, Father Riccardo began Acts XXIX in 2019 to equip clergy and the laity to “proclaim the Gospel in an attractive and compelling way.” He chose the name Acts XXIX because the Acts of the Apostles has 28 chapters and Catholics are now living the 29th chapter.

“The same Holy Spirit who wrote the first chapters of Acts is writing the next one,” Father Riccardo says.

The mission of Acts XXIX aligns with the vision for the Diocese of Crookston described by Bishop Cozzens in his 2024 pastoral letter *New Life Through the Tender Compassion of Our God*. Father Riccardo’s ministry, “aims to transform Catholic parishes into vibrant, mission-driven communities,” which follows Bishop Cozzens’ call for parishes to be “mission centers.”

Bishop Cozzens, “imagine[s] a time when most of our parishes are evangelizing and forming people to be disciples and evangelizers.” The pastoral letter calls on all Catholics to “evangelize by inviting others to discover new life in Jesus Christ and his Church.”

Rescue Live prepares Catholics to invite others into this new life. Over the course of the day, through talks, prayer, and small-group sharing, Rescue Live will present a biblical worldview and teach Catholics how to be heralds of hope who can proclaim the Kerygma, the core proclamation of the Catholic faith.

Father Riccardo summarizes the Kerygma as:

- Created: God created us out of love.
- Captured: We have become captured by sin.
- Rescued: God sent Jesus to free us from sin.
- Response: Our response is to share this Good News with the world.

For missionary disciples of Jesus, this basic proclamation of the faith is important for all to know. “As we seek to become more missionary in our parishes, we need to know the power of the Kerygma,” says Bishop Cozzens.

Deacon Gary Hager understands this power. Serving Holy Rosary parish in Detroit Lakes, Deacon Gary attended a Rescue Live revival in 2022. The day had an impact on him personally and for his ministry.

“For many years, I thought I understood the Kerygma, but it wasn’t until I attended Rescue Live and heard Father Riccardo explain the Kerygma that I truly understood it,” Deacon Gary says. “[Rescue Live] ... has impacted how I speak to others about God’s love for us, especially with youth preparing for confirmation and with pre-marriage couples.”

Rescue Live will be held at the Alerus Center in Grand Forks, ND, on October 10th, from 8am-5pm. Registration and more information can be found at [Crookston.org/RescueLive](https://www.crookston.org/RescueLive) beginning in February.
